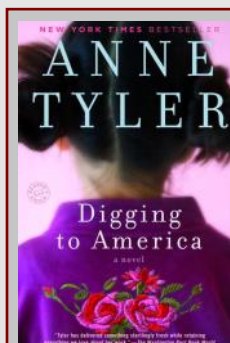

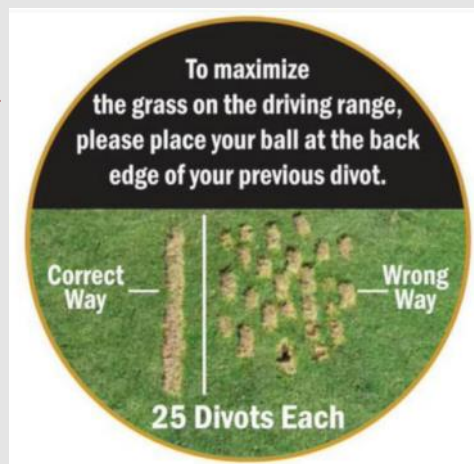

A Note from the Head Superintendent

In April we will be preparing for the growing season by getting our fertilizer put out and also our pre-emerge. These two things will help ensure a healthy stand of turf. We will slowly start lowering our mowing heights, especially on the greens, to get them to where they need to be for the season. We will be checking the amount of sand in our bunkers and adding where needed. It's time for some spring pine straw to spruce up the course and give the bare areas a playable surface, so we will take care of that this month also.

PSA for preserving grass on the range, courtesy of Golf Digest and College Golfers:

If you like grass on driving range, then please -- we implore you -- don't just scatter your range balls all over the place and start hitting them. Keep them in a pile, and hit them one-by-one. *Once you've hit one, place your next ball about an inch or so behind your previous divot and hit away. Trust us: It makes the range better for everyone."*

April Golf Tip

Anytime someone asks me to look at their chipping and pitching, the first two things I look at are width of stance and ball position. The majority of the time most players have a stance that is too wide. The proper width of the stance helps insure that the club bottoms out in the proper place. When it gets too wide the club bottoms out well before it gets to the ball with the results being mis-hit chips and pitches.

Also ball position is critical for solid contact. The proper position is just back of center of the stance. Too far forward or too far back makes it difficult too consistently strike the ball solidly.

The next time your short game starts to struggle, check to make sure those two components are correct. As far as your stance, err on being too narrow as opposed to being too wide.
